On November 2, 2023, Raksha Mantri Shri Rajnath Singh inaugurated the three-day India Manufacturing Show in Bengaluru, emphasizing the event's theme: "Make in India, Make for the World."

In his keynote address, Singh praised small-scale industries as the backbone of India's economy, highlighting their crucial role in socio-economic development and employment generation. He noted that small industries, with their adaptability and innovation, contribute significantly more than large industries relative to their investment, and historically, they have driven India's global reputation for industrial prowess.

Singh reflected on the historical significance of small industries, which once included textiles, iron, and shipbuilding, and stressed that they continue to be vital due to their ability to innovate and meet local needs effectively.

He also discussed various government initiatives supporting MSMEs, such as the MUDRA scheme and additional COVID-19 relief measures. Singh highlighted steps taken to bolster domestic defence manufacturing, including indigenisation lists and substantial budget allocations for local procurement. The Raksha Mantri further mentioned the iDEX initiative to foster innovation in defence through startups.
